

A NEW SOLAR POWERED ENDURANCE RECORD! BIG SCOOP BY THE "PLANE RAP" STAFF.

The Qinetiq Zypher, an 18 meter solar powered twin motor UAV recently set an endurance record of <u>14 days and 24 minutes</u> at a desert test facility in Arizona. See photos and aircraft details on pages 2 and 3 of this issue.

Zephyr and a New Solar Powered Endurance Record: 14 Days, 24 Minutes!

The Zephyrs were built by <u>QinetiQ</u>, formerly part of the United Kingdom's MOD (Ministry of Defense). They have been making assaults on the solar powered endurance record for the last several years.

The older version of Zephyr is shown at right. This photo shows the launch team of 3 members just after takeoff. Two members hold the outer wing panels and one person holds the fuselage. Together they run and toss the plane into the air. Don't ask "What if one guy trips?"

QinetQ released the following announcement on September 10, 2007:

The Zephyr solar-powered plane has set a new (unofficial) world record for the longest duration unmanned flight - 54 hours including two full nights. This smashed the official world record of under 31 hours set in 2001 by a USAF <u>Global</u> <u>Hawk surveillance aircraft</u>, and the 48 hour unofficial flight by Allan Coconi.



Now, with their new record of 14 days and 24 minutes, QinetQ released the following about their redesigned Zephyr.

Powered only by PV solar panels with rechargeable battery backup, The Zephyr is an ultra-light solar powered aeroplane designed to fly as high as 25 miles for weeks or months without landing. At such heights it will fly far above most weather and the commercial air-lanes in the sky. Therefore it will potentially revolutionize communications acting as a platform far cheaper than the satellites sent into orbit today.

Zephyr Technical Specifications:

Zephyr is a High Altitude Long Endurance (HALE) Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) made from carbon-fibre. It has a wing span of 18 metres and weighs in at just 30 kg - so light, it can be launched by hand. Propulsion is provided by two electric motor driven propellers.

Power is from an array of ultra-thin amorphous silicon solar cells (<u>United Solar Ovonic</u>) which cover the upper surface of the wings. During the daytime any excess generated power is used to recharge lithium-sulfur batteries (from Sion Power) which power the motors during the night.

Your editor's source has been through Jim Hynes of Continental Controls, who provided the following:

Paul Davey who has been program manager for 5 years provided these comments and the photos of the record setting plane.

"The flight went really well, 14 days and 24 minutes.

Forward looking video shots from 70kft were impressive, if poor quality, it's dark up there!

Mid-level wind caused a few problems half way through the flight but they managed to go under it for 2 days.

Batteries were superb, no cell hardware failures although some s/w snags that are easily sorted.

They should get the FAI records in a month or two."

The latest version with drooping wing tips and T tail is shown below. The story on the wing tips has not emerged, but we will publish it when it becomes available. Your editor is trying to be polite and not laugh. At least it held together for 2 weeks. At last report, the 18 meter wing was still of single (non-joined) construction requiring a massive shipping container. The Lithium Sulphur batteries are under development, and are reported to give over 400 Watt-Hours per kilogram. Note that our Lithium Polymer cells are about 150 to 200 Watt-Hours per kilogram, so we should soon have another major development for electric powered models.

HSS Meeting Minutes for August 3, 2010 HSS Minutes tcb

- I. The executive meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by Henry Smith III. In attendance were President Henry Smith III, Vice President Chris Adamczyk, Newsletter Editor Fred Hesse, General Director John Anderson, Treasurer Dennis Anderson, Competition Chairman Ross Thomas, and Secretary Ted Broberg.
- A. Fred told us that he has a presentation ready to describe to the general membership about the club's proposed web site redesign. (See II. D, below.)
- B. Mike Fox donated a HiTec NEON four-channel FM transmitter for tonight's raffle. Dennis Anderson contributed a bag of servos and parts for them. Thank you, Gentlemen!
- II. General Meeting, called to order at 6:56 p.m. Also attending were Fred Wilmott, Bob Voss, Henry Smith IV, Jim Hanson, Jerry Hunter, Ralph Chamberlin, Larry L. Koch, Mike Fox, Bill Lawrence, Jim McDonald, Chris Hill, Lucille Olszlewski, Jim Sonnenmeier, Jeff Green, Walter Stewart, and Roger Nahas.
- A. Henry told about a problem the first evening of this year's Tuesday Concerts in the Park (presented by the City of Costa Mesa). Several fliers (we think they were not club members) were impolite to the City's security personnel, and Park Superintendent Robert Staples got complaints the next day. Henry and Karl went to the field the following Tuesday Concert evening, and met the City's new Ranger, a pleasant lady. They spoke to the fliers. Henry thinks we'll see some improvements in the attitudes and actions of the "late shift."
 - B. Larry Koch said the new wind-indicator is almost ready.
 - C. Henry asked us to put together some kind of Fun Fly/contest soon. Please contact Henry to volunteer.
- D. Fred Hesse described a proposed redesign of the club's web site. Details are given in the article immediately following these minutes. A motion to adopt the proposal was moved and seconded; a discussion was held, questions resolved, and the motion was passed. Steering Committee will meet soon to discuss it further (see the minutes of the 6 August 2010 Steering Committee meeting below).
 - E. John Anderson reminded us that we need to elect officers for the next year. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!
 - F. Chris will be meeting with the city engineer regarding the water and electrical installations soon.
- G. Ross: September 19th, our club will be hosting the SC 2 soaring contest at SWSA's Irwindale site. We will need scorers and landing judges. We'll be using their equipment. Jim Hanson will be the Contest Director. It'll run from about 8:00 a.m. to noon or 1:00 p.m. Please let Ross know you'll be there to help! (714) 638-0705.
- H. Featured speaker, Chris Adamczyk: BUILDING LIGHT-WEIGHT COMPOSITE PLANES. He uses Mylar, Kevlar, fiberglass, and carbon fiber over HiLoad 60 blue foam. He makes his own ballast tubes and tubes for wing servo wires by epoxying fiberglass over K & E aluminum tubes, with Vaseline as a release agent. (Henry says McMaster and Carr sells a variety of release agents). ACT and CST web sites are good sources for Kevlar, but Aircraft Spruce has it for lower prices. Ace Hardware's lightweight Spackle is his filler of choice, to fill dings and dents. Nitrile gloves are a good choice to protect your hands; EPOXY IS A CUMULATIVE RISK. It can be absorbed through the skin. USE GLOVES (AND VENTILATION -- Fumes are hazardous, too.)
- -- "Bagging wings is the fun part." He spreads the resin with either a credit card, or with a short-nap paint roller from Ace. Cleanup solvent is acetone or denatured alcohol. Just throw the little fuzzy roller away. He measures his resin and hardener by gram weight, rather than by volume. (Harbor Freight has gram-ounce-pound scales for around \$20. They measure up to 11 pounds.) There are fast and slow hardeners. Chris laid up glass and Kevlar over a foam core for a sailplanes' flying stab. He rolled and squeegeed the epoxy carefully over the covering material, and laid it between sheets of grease-proof paper (wax paper), carefully lining every layer up, and then sandwiched it between the "beds" of foam from which the stab had been hotwired to shape. Then he lays "breather cloth" (paper towel over thin plastic sheet) over the assembled pieces, and slips it all into a vacuum bag. Ends of the bag are sealed with clips, and he attaches the suction pump's hose to the bag's fitting. The vacuum pump is left to cycle on and off overnight, so the epoxy is fully cured. He'll leave the elevator he built tonight in the "beds," in the vac bag, until he unveils it at next month's meeting.
- I. Henry Smith IV showed a model DeHavilland 84 DRAGON he bought that was CO2 powered, which he converted to brushed electric motor. It was a free-flight plane, but now it's an R/C.
- J. Drawing: Ralph Chamberlin won the HiTec NEON transmitter contributed by Mike Fox. Walter Stewart won the AVEOX motor and speed control set (gift of Dennis Anderson), and the Multiplex TWIN STAR was won by Mike Fox.
 - -- Meeting adjourned at 8:57 p.m. Respectfully submitted, Ted Broberg, Secretary.

HSS Executive Meeting Minutes for August 6, 2010

- I. Executive Committee meeting: In attendance were President Henry Smith, Vice President Chris Adamczyk, Treasurer Dennis Anderson, Newsletter Editor Fred Hesse, Competition Chairman Ross Thomas, and Secretary Ted Broberg.
 - A. Plans for the electric and water lines to the kiosk were discussed.
- 1. Karl has been in contact with the City's engineer. Fred and Chris will work with Karl in choosing an electrical junction and utility box, to recommend to that engineer. Chris has planned an appointment with the parks department to work out details for water connection.
- 2. Water line: We'll need to provide a water meter, back-flow preventer, and valve, per the city requirements.
 - B. Fred: Web site organization:
- 1. He recommends staying with the existing Headings (Home, Coming Events, Competition Results, Newsletter, etc.), but using a different organization of the content. We discussed the several items on a list of suggestions Fred provided, to determine which to use on the new website. Dennis warned that we must consider the threat of hackers invading the roster, if it were to be posted on the site. Henry also has concerns about site security.
 - C. Need for new officers for 2011: Who's willing?
- D. Ted: John Rittenhouse (who donated this month's TWIN STAR) has offered several more model planes for our raffle. He'll confer with Ted soon. Henry checked the back room of his shop for possible raffle items, and found none.

Results of Meeting With Parks Department

Our Vice President Chris Adamczyk, has been working to get a water main connection and electrical power so we can grow a grass landing strip for gliders, and provide 12 VDC power for flight battery chargers. He reports on his latest meeting Tuesday August 17th with Robert Staples as follows.

The meeting went well, for a start. I was told by the City Engineer that we could not connect to domestic water, but when he saw the size of the scheme and the fact that the original irrigation system called for potable water usage he was agreeable.

- 1: We have to locate the water line and pot hole the location as they don't know what sort of pipe is in the ground, I'll bring a metal detector from work.
- 2: Complete the proposed plumbing and wiring plan that will be situated at the new kiosk.
- 3: We need design calcs from an electrical engineer or city approved contractor for the power supply, covering the voltage drop to the bath room block and the load usage at the installation, is the size of the wire in the lines sufficient for the load.

PROPOSED HSS WEB SITE

The following is a condensed version of the presentation made to HSS members at the August 3rd General Meeting.

Our initial goal since early 2009 was to use a content management system that allowed relatively unskilled administrators to maintain our web site. Unfortunately the prototype system was not completed, so our web site has suffered from neglect recently. By chance, a company called Connect2Clubs has contacted Henry Smith concerning updating our existing web site. Here is what was proposed to the general membership.

Introduction:

Connect2Clubs.com is a web site design company located in Texas (877-767-6567), run by John and Anel Ryan. They feature a content management system (CMS) called DotNetNuke developed by a company in San Mateo, CA.

Cost:

The site design list price is \$259. This cost covers the design steps listed below, plus unlimited tech support and training. They offer web site hosting for \$10/month or \$100/year for a site size of 800 MBytes. Up and down link speeds are to be supplied, but are stated as "fast". They require a \$150 deposit through Paypal or credit card. On line payment is highly desired.

Design Effort:

The overall effort can take 2 to 3 weeks, and requires some HSS participation. Everything is done on a test site that we have private access to. The steps are:

- 1. They set up a test site, and transfer our existing site material to the test site. Our old site remains operational.
- 2. Next a conference call is held in which we review the desired content.
- 3. They develop the design.
- 4. We review the design on the test site, make revisions, then approve.
- 5. We pay the remaining costs of design and hosting.
- 6. They then conduct on line (conference type) training sessions, as needed.
- 7. They transfer our site URL and go on line. Our old site then goes off line from our existing provider.

Documentation:

We presently have their three pdf files containing about 1,500 pages of User Manuals. Interestingly, they say that their training sessions and tech support eliminates the need for these manuals except for reference.

Recommendation:

Since our existing web site is a prototype content management system that has a number of problems, and since the designer is no longer interested in providing tech support, this seems like a good move. The DotNetNuke program is presently being used by about 400,000 organizations. The only notable shortcoming is that our photo gallery would be limited to about 2,000 photos. We will continue to use www.1hss.org as our URL.

Conclusion:

The proposed website development was approved by the membership, and the initial down payment was authorized to Dennis Anderson, Treasurer. Upon receipt, Connect2Clubs began the new site design, and has completed everything except the administrator training. The following article describes our new web site that should be on line within the first week of September. We will notify all members by E-mail.

The New Harbor Soaring Society Web Site

HSS is embarking on a new era with our web site. We are extremely pleased to have the help of John and Anel Ryan of Connect2Clubs who have just completed the design of our new web site. A partial page print is shown below, and the site should be on line by early September. Our URL will remain the same (www.1hss.org) and this time the appearance and features are spectacular. As you can tell by the tabs, we will have easily accessible pages similar to the prior site but with much classier presentation. The photo gallery is improved, with titles and more information. A new "Members" tab will allow members (only) to have secure access to club information such as bylaws, AMA club charter, ballots, member surveys and other information not previously available to members, and officers will have a central repository for club documents such as city use permits, insurance confirmations, letter head forms, correspondence, and other information that so often gets lost every time we install new officers.

The site is designed around a Content Management System (CMS) called DotNetNuke, which is an industry standard application program that allows trained club members to perform site content management without having to know formal programming languages like HTML (Hyper Text Mark-up Language). Members are invited to contribute announcements, photos, items for sale, and want ads to the web site through Site Administrators to be announced shortly.

The feature sailplane of our masthead belongs to Larry Westman, from a photo taken at the Fairview slope in 2005. It is a Robbe Modellsport ASW 19 with a 3.13 meter wing span.




AMA Membership Renewals and Elections Next Month



Plane of the Month

Ralph Ranalli has been flying a high resolution aerial camera on his (TBS) pusher plane for several months. Rob Askegaard obtained the following photos of Ralph, his plane and his ground station.

Ralph provided the following descriptions, and the neat aerial photo of the park and another plane:

The Plane: Hobby Zone "Aerobird Xt reme" (2004) was modified by removing a 12 oz. 6 cell 2800 mah Ni-MH battery and replacing with two 2sip7.4 1900 mah li-poly packs in parallel saving 6 oz. and considerable volume.

The Camera: AIPTEK "Action HD" !080/720 hand held HD video and still camera weighing 7oz.fits in the space where the Ni-MH battery was, with the lens seeing just over the cockpit front wall, and held in by four rubber bands firmly holding down the canopy on top of the camera.

The Operation: Just before camera insertion, camera power is applied. Recording is started just before takeoff. Removable flash chips store the 720 p 60 fps HD video. ARCSOFT software supplied with the camera is used to view the file on the computer and at any point a frozen frame can be selected to produce a 2.6 mbit .bmp image file. A 10 minute flight could produce 36000 .bmp frozen images. In practice the fine selection can be used to pick the best image considering image framing, horizontal wing placement, any pitch considerations etc.

The Flight: At 43 oz. total weight, and perfect balance, flying and power off gliding is stable and predictable. No extra frontal area drag is presented and gliding with power off produces a "whistling" through the air recorded in stereo. Athletic field takeoffs and landings allow HD video of the surroundings of any "park" site, especially useful for school building site documentation. Thanks to both Ralph and Rob for the contributions. - ed.






