General and Business Meeting Minutes for 2 October 2012

- <u>I. Business Session:</u> Convened on 2 October at 6:17 p.m.: Walt Cloer, Henry Smith III, Fred Hesse, John Rittenhouse, Rob Askegaard, Dennis Anderson, Ted Broberg.
- A. Blimp hangar: Henry: -- We should compose a letter to send to Mark Denny, for AMA to send under their heading, requesting that Model Aviation be included in plans for the development of the former Lighter Than Air Base hangar. Fred and John R. will make up a draft, and send it around to HSS officers for input/additions, then forward it to AMA, to send to Mr. Denny. What we want is to have Model Airplane activities included in the plans for the Blimp Hangar.
 - B. Henry: We need to stay in the loop with the Orange County Parks Dept. He'll take steps to do so.
- C. Flying Field: Wait until after the City Council elections before moving on the Use Permit Extension, and then speak with them.
- D. Fred has made a contact list of national organizations we ought to communicate with. AMA has SIG's (Special Interest Groups), such as Indoor Free Flight.
- E. John: Let's see if we can get more people on board, with an outreach letter to flying groups. Send the letter to all on Fred's contact list.
- F. Fairview Park Use Permit renewal: Right after the election, let's move on the renewal; also, after that, we'll talk about the City's plan to move the paved trail. John will check with Mr. Staples tomorrow.
 - G. Fire extinguishers: John will provide funds. Ted will purchase and maintain.
- H. John Anderson will get Industry Association support and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM), and STEAM (added A for Arts) support.
 - I. Christmas Party plans: Erv will make the arrangements. More information to follow.
- <u>II. General Meeting:</u> Called to order at 7:19 p.m. by President Walt Cloer. In addition to those named above, in attendance were Henry Smith 4, Mike Fox, Jesse Calleros, Safety Officer Karl V. Hawley, William Vincent II, Bruce "Taz" and Linda Ellyson, Jeff Greene, and Jim Peterson.
- A. Walt: Credit to Karl for his effort for getting the charging station. Walt showed an 8 X 10 photo of his plane getting "refueled" at the station. Henry 3 suggests that a copy of the photo be sent to R/C clubs all over, to show them how our charging setup looks.
- B. Noisy fliers: Walt hears them in the morning. He has spoken to them several times. They fly right up to the pits. How do we police it up? Walt comments "We should have signs that ask fliers to reduce their noise. Most complaints from the public have been about noise, especially early in the morning." Suggestions: John Anderson: "Deputize club officers with power to ask the noisy ones to leave. Henry 3: "This is a hobby. We are not a law enforcement group. That's best left to the law people. You've done the right thing. The next step would be to contact the Park Rangers, and ask them to help us with the matter." John A: "Read them the ordinance they agreed to when they got their permit." Henry 3: "With the flying wings, just adding a one-inch extension on the prop adaptor, to get the prop out of the wake turbulence of the wing. That'll cut the noise by 90%." John A.: "Let's get a dB meter, and set a limit. Above that, tell them to quiet down or leave." John R.: "Let's put up signage with WEIGHT LIMITS, SPEED LIMITS, etc."
- -- ACTION ITEM: "I move that the steering committee meet and take on the signage task.: (Steering committee consists of President, Vice President, Treasurer, Executive Director, Contest Director, and Secretary.) " MOVED, SECONDED, and PASSED.
 - C. Walt: We need to have spotters.
 - D. John A.: Are we reaching the youth in the area?
- E. Ted: We need to have nominations for November's elections. Henry 3, Dennis, and Ted are willing to continue in their present positions.

- F. Show and Tell:
- -- Jessie: Eflite UMX CARBON CUB SS: Ailerons, flaps, navigation light, brushless motor, LiPo, \$160, w/charger, one battery, no transmitter. Optional little glider that it aero-tows.
 - -- Ted: HP 200 mini-helicopter: \$50, dual rotor, 2.4 gHz. Stable.
- -- Henry 4: Dumas Boeing P-26 PEA SHOOTER, in the bones. 17.5" wing span, about 1.5 ounces; brushed motor. Designed as a rubber-powered free flight. He plans to use Cover-lite. He's reduced weight, yet increased strength. He converted the single, 1/8 X 1/16" spar to use two 1/16" spars, set at the wing's maximum thickness. He added shear webs, and modified the wing tips for better washout. He hopes to airbrush the markings on.
- -- John Anderson: He showed a photo of one of his old full-sized hang gliders, and several model magazines to give away.
- -- Rob Askegaard: He showed photos he took recently at the Flabob Airport. This is home of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) in the Fontana/Riverside area. Many full size, classic and Old Timer aircraft were on display and flown.

Be a Concerned Enthusiast – Support the AMA

As discussed in the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation (the AMA publication sent to all AMA members), the federal government has passed the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, which includes Sec. 336 Special Rule For Model Aircraft. This law prevents the FAA from passing any rule that controls model aircraft being flown under the AMA safety code. The details appear on pages 14 and 15 of the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation. This Act resulted in part by the 90,000+ letters written by AMA members to their representatives.

The AMA will shortly be facing a new FAA regulation called the "small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (sUAS) rule. In the next several months the FAA will post the preliminary regulation for public review. At this time the AMA will initiate a concerned citizens organization made up of AMA members to express their opinions of the preliminary regulation. To do this rapidly, the AMA will again contact all members by E-mail with instructions on comments and congressional contacts, which means the AMA needs everyone's current E-mail address. If you are not presently receiving occasional E-mail from the AMA, please go to www.ModelAviation.com and update your personal information. It is important for all of us to actively support the AMA especially in this endeavor.







Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying Field Rules which are all posted at Fairview Park and on our web site at www.1hss.org. You do not need to be a Harbor Soaring Society member (but it is good to have you join us).

HSS Field Status

Our General Director, Henry Smith III, continues to work with Costa Mesa Parks Manager Robert Staples on several action items. These include the need to write a letter asking for the asphalt trail to be relocated during the upcoming renovation in the park. Best to wait until after the election and maybe after we are renewed. Our approach should be to plant some native grass in the trail area and then put up temporary fence while the new plants grow. At the same time make a few improvements (use HSS mower?) an alternate route leading over toward the restrooms. Also, another letter should be submitted asking for permission to put up the safety fence.

John Rittenhouse has offered to pay for a second fire extinguisher to be placed in the charging station. Ted Broberg offered to do the leg work, and has provided the following status report. Thanks to both John Rittenhouse and Ted Broberg.

Hi, John R.

Many thanks for your generous contribution to supply a fire extinguisher for the club. I went to the field (in the fog) today, and checked the old kiosk's extinguisher. It's a KIDDE Commercial, manufactured in July of 2008, so it's still fairly recent. It's pressure gauge is still in the green. I used it (and a tape measure) to check the new electrical panel box. It fits fine, and there's yet more room. I then went to a Walmart, and found the same type of unit. Both are 7 pounds plus, rated A, B, C: 3A, 40 B, and 40 C. For grass fires, they should do the job. I put the older one back in the old signboard kiosk, with all the earwigs.

I told Larry Koch the combinations of both boxes, as he's there more than most fliers and will pass the info on as he sees fit.

The Walmart price was \$39.77, with \$3.08 tax, for a total of \$42.85. I'll have the receipt and change for you next time we meet. I presume having two such tanks at the field will suffice. When I'm there, I think I'll open the box and bring the newer one out near the fence around the corral.

I also bought a five-gallon bucket and filled it with sand from OSH, for disposal of batteries and to help with fire suppression. We'll see if it stays there. The other half bag-full is in the shed. The sand bucket sits beneath the new charging station.

The Tustin Blimp Hangar Project

Several months ago, in fact June 2012, there was a rumor that the US Navy which presently controls the Tustin blimp hangar was going to turn the North hangar and about 85 acres over to Orange County Parks Department. HSS has put together a team consisting of Henry Smith III, John Rittenhouse, John Anderson, and Fred Hesse to confirm the story, and follow up with a plan in which indoor model aircraft could again be flown in the hangar. The team has met with Mark Denny, Director of Orange County Parks Department, and lobbied for the inclusion of indoor model aircraft activities in the department usage plan. We feel there is reasonable acceptance of our proposal by Mark Denny, and have developed our plan and requested national assistance from the AMA and/or National Free Flight Society (NFFS). You are invited to review the plan and related efforts on our web site www.1hss.org under the tab "Blimp Hangar Project".

As part of our plan we needed authority to represent the AMA and national modelers in general. We have just received the AMA letter which is shown below.

Dear Mr. Denny,

I represent the Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA). The AMA is a national organization that sanctions aeromodeling in the United States. For over 75 years the AMA has represented and supported all forms of sport and competitive model aircraft activities for a membership now over 150,000 members and 2500 chartered clubs.

The AMA provides our members with comprehensive safety rules, liability insurance, and representation to governmental agencies at all levels involved with air safety and regulation as related to model aircraft. We also provide educational programs, scholarships, and have initiated a "Get off the Couch and Fly" campaign to inspire and educate the next generation of young aviators. Moreover we sanction various national contests and record setting.

One of our primary activities involves the search for and retention of appropriate flying sites and facilities. In that regard, one of our chartered local clubs, the Harbor Soaring Society, based in Costa Mesa, has alerted us to the possibility of the Tustin MCAS blimp hanger facility being transferred from the U.S. Navy to the Orange County Parks jurisdiction. We also understand that under your direction, Orange County Parks is in the process of comprehensive reuse planning for this site including the historic blimp hangers.

As you may know, for over half a century, this facility has been an ideal location for numerous national and international flight endurance records and contest events since the 1940's, when the AMA sanctioned the Plymouth Regional model aircraft events.

Given the historic and unique nature of this facility for model aircraft activities and the possible prospects for enjoying such beneficial activities in the future, we respectfully urge you to consider the following:

- Include all appropriate types of model aircraft activities in the reuse planning process.
- Consider the use of some portion of the interior blimp hanger space to be made available to indoor model flying on a non-exclusive basis (no hanger improvements would be needed). Ideally, the space would be available on a regular basis and several times a year for local, national, or international competitions or special events. The types of such indoor flying would include small gliders, rubber-powered free-flying models, and small, slow, light-weight, electrically-powered radio-controlled

models. The huge, enclosed, windless, hanger space is a world-class venue for such models and associated record-setting.

- Also, ideally some portion of an outdoor park area could be designated for scheduled flying on a nonexclusive basis.
- During the extended planning process, we recommend that designated members of the local Harbor Soaring Society serve as our primary local representatives. They would work with the County, the AMA, and other interested parties to help assure effective communication.

Orange County and Southern California are rich in aerospace heritage and ongoing activities. Here, the Tustin MCAS facility, especially the northerly hanger could be a unique "one-of-a-kind" showcase of aviation history and world record-setting recreational model aircraft activity. Thus we encourage you to include such model aviation uses in your reuse plans.

We appreciate the prospective opportunity to offer constructive input into your reuse plan and thank you for your consideration of our interests. We look forward to a pleasant and productive relationship with you. And we optimistically expect that in effectively working together we can best provide demonstrable historical, recreational, and educational benefits to our national membership and to the citizens of Orange County.


