General Meeting Minutes for May 7, 2013

1. Business Session:

Meeting was held at Round Table Pizza in Fountain Valley, and was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Fred Hesse. Two officers were at the Costa Mesa City Council meeting that had on its agenda the renewal of our Use Permit. Officers in attendance were Vice President Jesse Calleros, Treasurer Dennis Anderson, Newsletter Editor Fred Hesse, and Secretary Ted Broberg, as well as Jim Sonnenmeier, Ross Thomas, Joni Whitsitt, Randy Wilbur, "Taz" and Linda Ellyson, John Anderson, Ken Downs, Bob Voss, Gary Gough, and John Krug.

- -- Fred brought up a list of topics that we should consider. See General Meeting minutes.
- In a discussion of a May 7th E-mail from Costa Mesa city hall, comment was made that the city plans not only a parking lot, but a baseball field and a socker field to be built after Harbor Soaring Society is evicted from Fairview Park. These are issues that need to be addressed soon.
- -- Joni: We need to work with the Orange County Model Engineers (OCME) group, as they have been selected for the citizens committee to revise the Fairview Park master plan, where HSS was not allowed on the committee. Note that OCME is up for a renewal of their 25 year permit in several months.
- -- Randy: June 7-9, 7th annual Scale Squadron Fly-in; Pomona Valley Field (Prado Airpark, Chino). **Fliers and Helpers wanted.** "Bring anything that looks Scale." He suggested that Rob A. might want to offer his beautiful photos for sale to the owners/fliers of these scale planes. Print up some nice business cards, Rob!

2. General Session:

Called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Vice President Jesse Calleros. Also In attendance were John Rittenhouse, Sid Hood. Henry Smith, General Director, came in late after attending the City Council meeting. See item M, below.

- A. PROGRAM: Jesse showed photos taken at the AMA Convention in January, and from the April 15th MCAS blimp hangar, while Jim Sonnenmeier provided commentary.
- B. Second Workshop at Blimp Hangar will be Wednesday, May 22, 5:30-7:30 p.m. Watch for an email blast. If you wish to attend, contact Fred by Monday, May 20.
- C. Today is the Costa Mesa City Council meeting where we are to be told of our renewal application for the Use Permit.
- D. We are working toward getting the support of Costa Mesa residents. Henry Smith went to the City Hall to get the names of Park Flying Permit holders who live in Costa Mesa (a matter of public record), and was denied that request.
- E. Moved and seconded that we put up a sign requesting fliers who live in Costa Mesa to sign up., whether HSS members or not. Move was carried. Who will do this?
- F. John Anderson: UCI's team took first place in the AIAA Heavy Lifter model design contest! This drew participants from all over the world! Yeah, Team! The UCI team used the HSS field for project development flight testing.
- G. John Krug mentioned that there is a huge area near Canyons College. This deserves a look-see as a possible alternate flying area.
- H. Outreach: John A. spoke recently with a woman at the Vet's Center. She said they would LOVE to learn to fly model planes.

- I. John Anderson felt that the HSS tri-fold brochure should it be redesigned and up-dated. Moved and seconded to produce a new issue, perhaps shaded toward an older target age segment. Carried. Jessie and John A. were assigned.
- J. John A.: Challenge to the club to make the effort to enlarge our sphere of influence, and attract a broader clientele: younger, females, college students in one of the aeronautics classes/– Broader member participation; and better "policing" of rule violators.
- K. Taz Ellyson has been attending a Wounded Warriors group that is passing World II vets' experiences of the War to this generation's youth. They are very interested in anything about flying and airplanes. Community Center at Lyons Park is where they meet. Contact Taz if you're interested. First Wednesdays.
- L. John A returned to his topic: Any more ideas for increasing our sphere of influence? Greater "visitor" facilities. John suggested building visitor bleachers. Taz suggested:asking an Eagle Scout group to make some visitor seating. Put up some sun shades.
- M. Henry Smith 3 announced by phone that we have been granted the one-year Use Permit extension. See his note, item P below. Due to the dilatory nature of city hall, this permit concludes at the end of this year.
- N. Regarding the Rule Busters, remind them that the fee for flying without a permit is about \$300, and the Rangers have been enforcing the rules.
- O. Jesse showed two foamie planes that he is donating to someone to give to young people who come by and show interest. Thanks, Jesse.
- P. Henry 3 came over after the Council meeting to report: "Two members of the City Council asked that our renewal request be pulled out for discussion, and they both asked that we be given a five year extension. We owe these two some big compliments. We will need to work hard to keep the use of the field. We'll have to gather some support. WE ARE IN JEOPARDY. OBEY THE RULES." He suggests that we take pictures of violators, and note the date and time, with a description of the violation. A report can be given to the police/rangers.

<u>Show and tell:</u> Henry 3 showed his new Steven's Aero RV-4, and described the fine laser-cut pieces. "It's like a small Proctor.














HSS Gold Level Leader Club Status for 2013



Tustin Hangar Second Public Workshop Report

This is a report on the 2nd Public Workshop for the Tustin Regional Park (often referred to as the Tustin Blimp Hangar).

First, I want to thank the over 80 enthusiasts that showed up for the first workshop on April 15. We made a tremendous impact on the planning group. Thanks for your inputs to them.

The 2nd workshop was held on 22 May, with the presentation of the initial plans for the new park. Because of your comments, model aircraft was included in 5 different places in their presentation. This is good, but we now want to reinforce and detail our desires. Eight HSS members attended the second workshop, and made inputs at that time. However we now have a great opportunity to really bring in our message.

The park planners had many pages of detail for their initial plans. This 50 page document is on the OC Parks website, www.ocparks.com. You now have the opportunity to review this document at your leisure, and submit your own ideas.

Here is what we need you to do. After reviewing the document, respond with your own E-mail to tustinmcas@ocparks.com. Tell them that you like the park plan, and include some complementary comments. Next, re-affirm that you support use of the hangar for indoor model aircraft, and also outdoor model flying. Finally, include your own suggestions. While the outdoor model flying was not our primary goal, it turns out they received requests for outdoor control line flying, outdoor R/C gliders and electric planes, and free flight model aircraft, and have shown it included in their plan. While a specific location was not shown, we saw notes suggesting that the south event space made up of the "South Plaza" and "Hangar Meadow" were being considered (Pages 29 and 40). This is a very nice concrete area for control line and electric RC runway. Immediately adjacent (the meadow) is all grass and flying could extend out over what they call "Linear Park" (a future development). A great place for sailplanes! Suggest that only a limited number of trees be placed in this area.

Be positive, be constructive, and most of all be heard. This can work, as we see a very supportive attitude in all the planners.

Be a Concerned Enthusiast – Support the AMA

As discussed in the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation (the AMA publication sent to all AMA members), the federal government has passed the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, which includes Sec. 336 Special Rule For Model Aircraft. This law prevents the FAA from passing any rule that controls model aircraft being flown under the AMA safety code. The details appear on pages 14 and 15 of the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation. This Act resulted in part by the 90,000+ letters written by AMA members to their representatives.

The AMA will shortly be facing a new FAA regulation called the "small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (sUAS) rule. In the next several months the FAA will post the preliminary regulation for public review. At this time the AMA will initiate a concerned citizens organization made up of AMA members to express their opinions of the preliminary regulation. To do this rapidly, the AMA will again contact all members by E-mail with instructions on comments and congressional contacts, which means the AMA needs everyone's current E-mail address. If you are not presently receiving occasional E-mail from the AMA, please go to www.modelaircraft.org and update your personal information. It is important for all of us to actively support the AMA especially in this endeavor.

Cessna/Raytheon/AIAA Foundation Design, Build, Fly Competition


HSS graciously provided our flying field as a test facility to the University of California Irvine Design, Build, Fly competition team for their entry. Here is a brief report and the results.

The 2013 AIAA/Cessna Aircraft Company/Raytheon Missile Systems Design/Build/Fly Competition Flyoff was held at TIMPA Field in Tucson, AZ on the weekend of April 19-21, 2013. This was the 17th year the competition was held. Of the 90 entries this year, 81 teams submitted written reports to be judged and were eligible to participate in the flyoff. Sixty teams attended the flyoff, of which 55 completed the technical inspection (five teams attended even though their airplanes had irreparable damage prior to the competition). Over 600 students, faculty, and guests were present. The weather was sunny and warm allowing for non-stop flying. Of the 186 official flight attempts, 95 resulted in a successful score divided among 54 teams. Twelve teams successfully completed all three missions. The quality of the teams, their readiness to compete, and the execution of the flights continues to improve each year.

The contest theme this year was the Joint Strike Fighter. The first mission was a Short Take-off mission with no payload followed by a Stealth mission with internal payload only and a Strike mission which consisted of 6 possible payload configurations with various combinations of internal and external stores. The configuration for each mission 3 attempt was determined by a role of the dice by each team immediately prior to their flight attempt. As usual, the total score is the product of the flight score and written report score. More details on the mission requirements can be found at the competition website: http://www.aiaadbf.org .

First Place went to the University of California Irvine, Second Place went to San Diego State University and Third Place went to Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. A full listing of the results is included below. The Best Paper Award, sponsored by the Design Engineering TC for the highest report score, went to Cornell University with a score of 96.00.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying Field Rules which are all posted at Fairview Park and on our web site at www.1hss.org. You do not need to be a Harbor Soaring Society member (but it is good to have you join us).



Plane of the Month - A Pair of Pretty Partenavias

Our featured models of the month are a pair of pretty Partenavia's, one built by Ken Blasius, and shown at right. The other is your editor's plane shown on the next page.

Ken's plane is a Graupner ARF, which strangely could not be found on the internet, except in German terminology. It is a great flying model as shown in the inverted fly by.

Your editor just loves this plane, and built a 1.5 meter version back in 2009. This is a foamie produced by Conzelmann Modeltechnik. Power is powered by a pair of brushed 480 can motors that gave good power and long service (surprisingly). Ice crème spoon air scoops were added on the sides to facilitate ESC cooling. It was given a very nice finish by sanding all of the mold marks off, then filling all surfaces with light Spackle. Next a water soluble primer was used, and the finish incorporated a water soluble latex spray paint made by Krylon. The graphics are large, sticky-back vinyl, including the ones covering the entire top of the wing.

This may be out of date, but this model was purchased from Ducted Fans.com, PO BOX 13848 Fairlawn, OH 44334. Phone 330-872-8381. Cost was \$160 without motors.
