Other officers in attendance were Vice President Jesse Calleros, Newsletter Editor Fred Hesse, Club Photographer Rob Askegaard, Jim Hansen, and Secretary Ted Broberg, as well as Ross Thomas, Richard Baxter, John Rittenhouse, Jeff Greene, Joni Whitsitt, Randy Wilbur, Mike Fox, Roger Nahas, and William Vincent II.

- A. HENRY: there are many issues we need to handle. Fred Hesse posted his agenda:
- 1. UCI's Design/Build/Fly team came to our meeting tonight. See PROGRAM, below.
- 2. Club projector: Jesse got an EPSON.
- 3. We need some support for HSS hosting of 21 July SC2 soaring competition. (Jim Sonnenmeier CD). SWSA's field, in IRWINDALE, near 605 and 210. Help needed! See any of our glider folks.
- 4. AIAA, The American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics: Fred will be making a presentation to them 6:30 Tuesday, July 9 at Boeing, Huntington Beach. Contact Fred if you wish to attend. Pass required. Get on attendance list.
- 5. Fourth of July Vets' Day: We'll have intro trainer planes for the Vets' Club of OCC. 8:00 a.m. John Anderson and Ted B., plus maybe Henry III, who has a parade commitment.
- 6- National Model Aviation Day 17 August; Saturday. HSS will join OCMA at Black Star. Fun Fly, Charitable event for Semper Fi organization., who help returned Marines. Possible activities listed on P. 8 of March newsletter. Fred: AMA is trying to promote model aviation, and is asking all clubs to have some sort of event to boost our hobby. He suggests that we put on an air show We have several really good helicopter pilots, and we have many stunt/3D fliers who could put on a good show. Ducted fans would add a dimension. And our sailplane launching system is spectacular. Aero tow would add to it. Discus-launched gliders would be fantastic. FPV (First Person View) is something to consider. Free flying lessons could be available. Randy Wilbur. Raffle. AMA card needed to fly. Charity event to help injured soldiers. \$20 donation.
 - -- We'll need an email blast to alert our members.
- 7. Henry got a list of AMA members in our area (Central Orange County): 360. We need to reach them with a P R notice, telling of the issues facing our club. We need as many people as we can to help us in our efforts. He wants a flyer assembled, asking for their help. Joni suggests we contact them through their email addresses, with a survey that tells what it's about, and a form to indicate their interests and support.
- John A. mentioned that he heard from Karl Hawley, who said our archives should have documents of the ORIGINAL ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN HSS AND THE CITY. Judy Gielow (sic) may have that in her files.
- 8. John also suggests contacting the OCME (Orange County Model Engineers), to plan some joint HSS and OCME events, to gather signatures of the people who would support us before the City Council and Fairview Park Citizen's Advisory Committee.
- 9. Henry suggests that the club provide a landing mat for the helicopter group, to keep down the dust.
- 10. Fred has 100 new tri-fold brochures for us to present at the Orange County Fair this summer.
- 11. Joni Whitsitt is taking names for volunteers for Orange County Fair, July 19, 20, 21: Home and Arts building. She sent a clipboard around for sign-ups, and will have her list at each meeting until the Fair.
- 12. John A. showed an example of a simple stick-and-paper airplane design that we could hand out at our field, with our logo and information on it.
- 2. Program: Team from UCI who won the DESIGN/BUILD/FLY contest this past year. John Chen, pasty project manager;/ 'AR 1': Paul Purcell present project manager.. Held in Tucson; 80 teams entered from around the world. College students with faculty advisors. Rules included 1.5 pound limit for the battery; 20 Amp fuse, NiCd batteries. Theme: Rockets. Three missions. Time/payload/ number of laps per time considerations. The rockets that made up the payload had to fit inside the airfoil, and under the wing. Course included two 180 degree turns, with a 360 turn on one leg. Their presentation included several graphs and formulae that they produced. Their team was about 30 people, the largest team in the competition this year. They cleared tech inspection on their first check. Each of the three missions has a weighted value, with payload missions counting more that the first mission, number of laps completed per time limit.. Their email address is lsng@uci.edu.

Celebrate the First Annual National Model Aviation Day



Be a Concerned Enthusiast – Support the AMA

As discussed in the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation (the AMA publication sent to all AMA members), the federal government has passed the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, which includes Sec. 336 Special Rule For Model Aircraft. This law prevents the FAA from passing any rule that controls model aircraft being flown under the AMA safety code. The details appear on pages 14 and 15 of the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation. This Act resulted in part by the 90,000+ letters written by AMA members to their representatives.


The AMA will shortly be facing a new FAA regulation called the "small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (sUAS) rule. In the next several months the FAA will post the preliminary regulation for public review. At this time the AMA will initiate a concerned citizens organization made up of AMA members to express their opinions of the preliminary regulation. To do this rapidly, the AMA will again contact all members by E-mail with instructions on comments and congressional contacts, which means the AMA needs everyone's current E-mail address. If you are not presently receiving occasional E-mail from the AMA, please go to www.modelaircraft.org and update your personal information. It is important for all of us to actively support the AMA especially in this endeavor.

Nice photo. I can't recall the students' names, but I have that plane. It's one of the SUPER CUBS, and it was donated to me several years ago by Ralph Chamberlin (sic). I used it for a second trainer, between EASY STAR/SUPERFLY/RADIAN-type hand-launch power-gliders and more serious power planes. I also used it as a "carrot" to get Bruce "Taz" Ellyson (Korean war veteran) to jump through some hoops. He could have it, if and only if he'd get his AMA license, get a Park Permit, and make ten good take-offs and landings. He did so, and since has bought his own air force. A few months back, he returned the CUB to me with new wings, and it's ready to go again.

My plan for it is to make it part of a package to be donated to the OCC Veterans' Club, if John and I ever get a few "regulars" into the sport. So far, four people from that group have taken intro lessons. One, Jimmy Anderson (not shown), has done two Saturday classes with me. Costa Mesa City Hall (77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa 92626) – 3rd floor Recreation Counter, during regular business hours from 8:00am – 4:30pm (excluding City observed holidays). Call 714-754-5300 for details.

Temporary permits are issued at the Downtown Recreation Center (1869 Anaheim Avenue, Costa Mesa 92627) between the hours of 10:00am – 1:00pm on Saturdays. For information, call 714-327-7560.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying Field Rules which are all posted at Fairview Park and on our web site at www.1hss.org. You do not need to be a Harbor Soaring Society member (but it is good to have you join us).
