

General Meeting Minutes, Tuesday August 3, 2021.

Our General Meeting was held on Tuesday August 3, 2021 at the Round Table Pizza Restaurant, 1175 Baker Street Costa Mesa. The meeting was called to order at 7:07 PM by President Mike Costello.

Unfortunately your secretary was not in attendance, but Don Wittenberg stepped up to assist in taking the following minutes of the meeting. Thanks Don.

• Don Wittenberg presented noise data he took at the Sunday 7/31 Concert in the Park at Fairview Park. The event started at 1:00 and featured a popular rock group at 5:00. The stage was set up at the grassy area East of the flying field and bordered on the south by the fenced-off vernal pond area and the Placentia High sports field. Thousands attended. The CM Parks, Arts and Community Services (PACS) committee had several large pop-ups and booths giving away snacks and attended by local city officials.

One complaint leveled against our flying model airplanes is that our planes are too noisy and disturb birds.

Here are peak noise measurements taken with a noise meter during the event.



Table N-1 of CM General Plan shows "Sound Levels and Human Response"

60 dBa Intrusive

80 dBa Annoying

{Decibels (dB) are based on the logarithmic scale. A sound of 10 dB higher than another is judged to be twice as loud; and 20 dBa higher four times as loud}

Similar data taken for comparison of a typical model airplane with the same noise meter:

58 dBa Grumman F-8F, electric, full throttle, peak, nose toward meter, 45 feet away.

Using the inverse-square law for sound attenuation with distance, that 58 dBa would be 48 dBa at 150 foot distance, a fair distance away from any pedestrians at the park. (50 dBa is considered Quiet per Table N-1) Clearly, this event exceeded the noise levels established under the CM General Plan while our model airplanes are relatively quiet.

It is doubtful that CM Council members would allow elimination of their chance to meet-and-greet the voters.

• There was discussion of the PACS resolution to allow HSS to reopen at its current location and be evaluated for compatibility with the park while relocation to the other side of Placentia is studied. HSS needs to propose revisions to the Permit Process and Fly Field Rules. These revisions will include concessions considered necessary to win approval for our continued use of the flying field. We need to

- show that we are willing to compromise. They will be sent to Cynthia D'Agosta, FVP Administrator. Opening of the airfield would take more than 3 to 6 months after approval by the city council.
- John Anderson suggested that HSS needs to increase visibility of our community services and benefits.
 Our outreach should include, as in the past, speakers to give basics of aeronautics to high school classes. We might also present to senior centers.
- Mike said that we have an attorney working to change HSS status to 501c3 non-profit as benefit to the community at large. The city will be more amenable to deal with HSS as a 501c3. Mike is looking into establishing Aero 101 classes to be publicized on the CM website like the swimming and karate classes.
- Henry mentioned that he and Ted Broberg had taught dozens of beginning pilots to fly at the field. We need to have student permits and keep track of those students as proof of benefit to the community.
- HSS members can sign up for Cub kits for free-flight contest with the Black Sheep Squadron. See Fred Hesse.

Show and Tell

- Henry showed his balsa wing for his De Havilland Hummingbird from a Stevens Aero kit. This is the
 wing that mates with the fuselage that he showed us last meeting.
- Jordan showed his lightweight Sopwith Triplane, built by Dave Watson. Shown here on the dashboard
 of his car to show its scale. 17" wingspan, 1S battery. "It flies very nice and slow, meant for indoors
 but can be flown outdoors without wind. It will do consecutive horizontal rolls with a bit of rudder and
 elevator."
- Jordan demonstrated his ornithopter with a carbon fiber frame and fabric covered wings and tail. The
 wings and tail flap like a bird's wings and tail.





 John Anderson showed his "FPG1" glider model made from a foam picnic plate, powered by a capacitor battery. John flew his model in the room for about 10 feet despite the downdraft from the ceiling fan,



Proposed Flying Field Rules

Your HSS officers have been struggling to prepare a set of flying field rules suitable to the City of Costa Mesa, and agreeable to the Fairview Park Steering Committee. After months of revisions and meetings with City staff, the following is hopefully something everyone can agree to. Read Mike Costello's comments in the Message From The President for the next step in obtaining a Use Permit. Thanks, Mike for your hard work and great leadership.

FAIRVIEW PARK FLYING FIELD RULES 2021

1.0 Field Rules: The intent of these rules is to promote flying safety, financial responsibility and environmental protection by maintaining order, controlling frequency usage, educating and training fliers, and to act as good neighbors to the community.

Rules are based upon the City of Costa Mesa's Ordinance #07-01, FAA Advisory Circular AC 91-57, and the AMA Safety Code. All pilots must follow these rules to fly at Fairview Park.

- 2.0 Permit Requirements: All pilots are required to have a permit to fly at Fairview Park. This permit ensures each pilot has financial responsibility and promises to follow these field rules. The permit is obtainable from the City of Costa Mesa, Recreation Division. The only exception is the following:
- 2.1 Visiting Pilots: Licensed AMA members, who are experienced pilots visiting Fairview Park to participate in a City-approved scheduled event. Visiting pilots must show event organizer their AMA Membership license, and review and agree in writing to the Flying Field Rules. They are then allowed to fly in the event.
- 2.3 All pilots must display their permit above the waist at all times while operating a model aircraft. Visiting pilots must display their AMA membership card.
 - 3.0 Environmental Protection: Vernal pools are large, shallow depressions in the ground that acquire several inches of water during rainy seasons. These pools contain Fairy Shrimp that are an endangered species and are protected by Fairview Park ordinances. Everyone is restricted from walking in the vernal pool areas, whether wet or dry. Pilots should fly over the vernal pools only at an altitude that ensures they will not land in the pool area. If your aircraft lands in a vernal pool or marsh, do not enter. Call the Park Ranger and make arrangements for retrieval. 714- 754-5252 (you'll have to wait until they arrive).

Launching or landing aircraft equipped with floats is not permitted in the pools.

Harassment of animals and birds is not allowed in the park. Do not disturb native plants.

- 4.0 Safety: All pilots must follow the Official AMA National Model Aircraft Safety Code, which is posted at the flying site, in addition to the following field rules.
- 4.1 72 Mhz Frequencies only: Before turning on a transmitter, each pilot must first check the frequency control board to ensure no other pilot is using the frequency the pilot wishes to use. The pilot must then place an identification clip on that frequency on the board. Identification clips are to have the channel number and the pilot's first and last name. Only then may the pilot turn on the transmitter and fly the aircraft. When finished flying, the pilot must remove the clip from the control board. No clip may be attached to an existing clip. A pilot may use only one frequency channel at a time.

When other flyers are using the frequency the pilot wishes to use (and they have their clip on the frequency number), a pilot must make every reasonable attempt to locate those flyers. Check all cars in the parking lot and also flyers on the slope soaring area. Once the pilot using the desired frequency is identified, and if shared usage is agreed upon, flight reservations should be limited to no more than 20 minutes by each pilot.

All pilots must display their City issued permit above their waist.

4.2 New Aircraft: All new aircraft must have a radio range check performed before its first flight. Any crashed aircraft should also be radio range checked after repair.

Proposed Flying Field Rules (Continued)

- 4.3 Model Aircraft Must Be Identified: All model aircraft must be identified with the owner's FAA Registration Number, pilots, name, address and AMA number on outside of the aircraft.
- 5.0 General Field Rules:
- 5.1 Model aircraft are restricted to fixed-wing airplanes as follows:
 - o Electric powered aircraft only
 - No fuel-powered aircraft
 - Propeller axis must be fixed in forward direction only
 - Propeller must be in front of leading edge of wing
 - o No EDFs (Jets), Flying Wings, Helicopters or Rockets
 - Aircraft must not generate more than 70 dBA noise level measured at distance of 50 feet. See list at the kiosk of the only classes of aircraft that meet this criterion.
 - All aircraft must have flying weight 6 pounds or less.
- 5.2 Rules applicable to all model aircraft: Every pilot shall perform a pre-flight inspection prior to each launching of their aircraft to ensure that the aircraft is safe to fly and no unobserved damage was sustained from the previous flight.
- 5.3 Excluded Flying Areas: Aircraft should not be flown over the Waldorf School, nor the parking lot, residences, and pedestrians on or off the paths.
- 5.4 Flying Methods: No Combat flying allowed. No high speed passes at low altitude over the runway. Flying near people is not allowed. The flight line for a powered aircraft is identified on the attached site map in front of the pit area. Flying behind the flight line is not allowed.
- 5.5 All aircraft flights must be within line of sight and be within the boundaries of the permitted flight area, as depicted on the posted flight map and indicated by markers as seen from the flight line.
- 5.6 First Person View pilots MUST have an observer and remain within the designated flight area at all times.
- All Flight operations must be restricted to 400 ft or lower as permitted by FAA agreement.
- 5.7 Deleted.
- 5.8 Hours of Use: 8AM to 4PM winter PST and 8AM to 6 PM summer DST.

Field is closed on Tuesdays, Thursdays and periods of critical bird nesting, as defined by an independent ornithologist and posted at the field kiosk. Field is also closed when the runway is muddy.

- 5.9 Pedestrian Traffic: Pilots MUST NOT fly close to pedestrians, skaters and bicyclists using the park. Maintain a safe distance between your aircraft and park users.
- 6.0 Specific Flying Areas and Rules (Consult Flying Field Map and Fairview Park Master Plan):
- 6.1 Gliders: Gliders shall be launched from the designated area marked on the map, using hand launch, electric winches, electric motors or bungee hi-starts. Gliders should use the area north of the runway with care. Gliders in flight have the right-of-way over powered aircraft. Gliders in flight have the right-of-way over gliders being launched.
- 6.2 Electric powered model aircraft: Electric powered models are to be flown from the runway shown on the map. Do not fly behind the flight line (or dead line), over the paved pedestrian path or anywhere south of the runway. Powered aircraft must yield right-of-way to gliders. Pilots must remain out of the landing area except when retrieving their planes.

Proposed Flying Field Rules (Continued)

- 6.3 Slope soaring gliders: Slope soaring gliders may use the bluff at the western edge of Fairview Park. Electric powered aircraft are not allowed on the bluff. Pilots should avoid landing in the vernal pools. Pilots must follow frequency control procedures.
- 6.4 Motor gliders: Motor gliders should be launched in the vicinity of the glider winch.
- 6.5 Hand launched gliders: Hand launched gliders are to be flown from the area designated on the map.
- 6.6 3-D Stunt Planes: These aircraft are to be flown in the area indicated for electric power aircraft.
- 6.7 Helicopters: Helicopters are not permitted.
- 6.8 Free flight model aircraft: Free flight models are currently being flown on a grassy area within the developed part of the park.
- 7.0 Large Events: Harbor Soaring Society (HSS) is authorized to hold model aviation events that are scheduled by HSS and a Special Event Permit has been issued by the City. This applies to events anticipating the attendance of 25 or more participants. During these one to two (1–2) day events, the field will be closed to the general public flying for part of each day. The hours must be announced and posted at least two (2) weeks in advance.
- 8.0 Regulations Enforcement.
- 8.1 Any permitted flyer may request an offender cease inappropriate behavior. If the offender refuses to change his behavior, an HSS officer will contact a Park Ranger who will cite the offender and secure his/her permit.
- 8.2 Pilots who cause damage to another's aircraft through rules violation must pay for the damage.
- 9.0 Emergencies and who to contact:

Subsequent to the challenge, your editor responded to Black Sheep Squadron as follows.

OK as any typical competitor would ask, how stock is stock? Following are a number (but not all) of the aircraft specifications that could be subject to refinement.

- 1. Motor. I/8" only (or possibly 3/16")?. How long and how many strands to the motor? What about competition indoor rubber?
- 2. Is rubber lube legal?
- 3. Can a hand carved balsa prop be used? Are folding props allowed?
- 4. Can lighter wheels be used. Is ROG required? Can the landing gear be omitted?
- 5. What types of covering are allowed?
- 6. Can structural modifications be made? Lighter spars with carbon reinforcement?
- 7. Changes in flight surface area and/or shape? Modified airfoil?

I don't mean to be a troublemaker, but after all, our club's reputation is at stake. Sunny Regards, Fred Hesse Dave Gee, President of Black Sheep Squadron, responded as follows.

Any size motor, lubed or not. Stock diameter plastic prop, non folding. No gadgetry. Stock airframe, subtle changes OK. Any covering. Hand launch because ROG is a pain for older guys, but gear and wheels must be present 'cause that's part of a stock airframe. Any wheels if stock diameter. Any airfoil, but the stock one works pretty good on this ship.

This challenge was initiated in early July, but now, time is running out, so sign up soon. We may need to ask for a schedule extension?




